



Skinner wins every city in SD9 race.

Skinner defeats Swanson in Oakland and AD18 – finishes primary with over \$900,000 cash on hand.

Final election results from Alameda and Contra Costa County demonstrate that SD9 candidate Nancy Skinner ran strongly throughout the district in the June primary election.

Skinner finished far ahead of former Assemblymember Sandre Swanson, taking 47.8% of the vote to Swanson's 30.5%. Looking at the numbers by community reveals that Skinner defeated Swanson in every city in the District.

Oakland, which was thought to be Swanson's base, went for Skinner 43.2% to 39.9%. Swanson's hometown of Alameda voted for Skinner by a 41.2% to 30.8% margin. On the other hand, Skinner won her home city of Berkeley by a thumping 37.7% margin (62.6% to 24.9%).

Skinner won both counties in the District: Alameda, 47.2% to 33.5%; and Contra Costa, 49.9% to 19.3%.

Skinner won both Assembly Districts: AD15, which she represented in the Assembly for 6 years, went for Skinner by a massive 54.0% to 23.9% margin. Most significantly, Skinner defeated Swanson in AD18, the District he represented for 6 years, by a narrow 39.8% to 38.9%.

It is also important to note that Skinner's AD15 produced over 30,000 more total votes than did AD18.

"If Swanson cannot carry Oakland, Alameda or even his own former Assembly District, it is extremely difficult to see how he charts a path to victory in November," stated Skinner's campaign consultant Parke Skelton.

In addition, Skinner ended the June primary with over \$90,000 cash on hand, choosing to husband resources for the November runoff. Swanson reported a meager \$56,043 cash on hand with \$40,320 in outstanding debt in the 5/21 campaign filing.
